 Child Guidance Centre this year entered its 34th year of functioning. There was a significant structural development in the school. The Special School now has its new building which in due course of time is expected to expand further.

- This year the school strength has reached a remarkable figure of 190. However we find ourselves serving a limited population and hope to serve more in our near future.
- A new unit has been added to our school this year- The Hydrotherapy Unit. This unit will be especially useful for the children with Cerebral Palsy.
- The school this year with the cooperation of the Rotary Club have successfully distributed free wheel chairs, splints, walkers, and tricycles to the children with Cerebral Palsy.
- Ms Mary Deputy General Secretary, Child Guidance Centre has been elected as a member of the Child Welfare Committee of the Ranga Reddy District.
- Twenty-three students participated in the Special Olympics conducted at the district level at the RRC gardens. Out of these students 19 got prizes for various events such as Soft Ball throw, Bocce, Shot Put and Running. Thirty students participated in the Uncle Babji's "All India Child Art Contest-2006 and obtained prizes.

- This academic year thirty students have written the A.P Open School Examinations. Sixteen students wrote the 7th standard examinations, 2 have written the 6th standard exams, while 14 have written the 9th standard examinations.
- Preventive Medicines for Chikangunya and Dengue was distributed by the team of CGC at Machlipatnam and in the areas of the Ranga Reddy District. Information regarding the fever and causes was provided through songs and body theater. Charts were prepared regarding the causes and importance of keeping the environment clean and green was explained to the people. About 1000 people were given free homeopathic pills for prevention of the fever

• Community Based Rehabilitation Programs have been an integral part of the regular programs conducted at Child Guidance Centre. This year CBR camps were conducted in the villages of Chagala, Ghanapur, Tanderapally, Atmakur, Akkampeta and Nashrikallu in the Warangal district of Andhra Pradesh. The villages in the Guntur district which were selected for the camps are Nizamapatnam, Palley Pallam, Chandra Mouli Nagar, Nakshatra Nagar, Gunapthippa and Nakshatra Nagar were the villages where the camp was conducted. About 150-disabled population were identified and appropriate referrals and intervention programs were given to them.
